Subject: Increase of seats in MD(Dermatology, Venerology & Leprosy) course at K.V.G. Medical College & Hospital, Sullia, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10(A) of the IMC Act, 1956 for academic year 2020-21 - Permission of Board of Governors - Regarding.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer your proposal for Increase of seats in MD(Dermatology, Venerology & Leprosy) course at K.V.G. Medical College & Hospital, Sullia, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C Act, 1956 for the academic year 2020-21.

It is to inform that the Board of Governors considered the Council Assessor's report (11/10/2019) together with the recommendations of the PG Expert Group (BoG) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at K.V.G. Medical College & Hospital, Sullia, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD(Dermatology, Venerology & Leprosy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2020-21 and decided as under:

"The Board of Governors considered the Council Assessor's Report (11/10/2019) together with the recommendations of the PG Expert Group (BoG) and decided to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD(Dermatology, Venerology & Leprosy) course at K.V.G. Medical College & Hospital, Sullia, Karnataka under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2020-2021 from 02(Two) to 04(Four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956."

It is also to inform that the Board of Governors further decided that Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD(Dermatology, Venerology & Leprosy) course from 02(Two) to 04(Four) seats as per available facilities, with prospective effect i.e. from the academic session 2020-21 at K.V.G. Medical College & Hospital, Sullia, Karnataka u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 may be issued.

In view of the above decision, the Council has decided to obtain undertaking/ essential documents for issue of Letter of Permission for starting/ increase in seats for the academic year 2020-21:-

1. The applicant should provide all infrastructural facilities in terms of teaching and non-teaching staff, buildings, equipment and hospital facilities as per Medical Council of India norms.
2. No student should be admitted in the above courses till the formal permission of the Board of Governors is granted.
3. The Private Medical College should provide Bank Guarantee of required amount in favour of Medical Council of India, New Delhi valid for three years from a nationalized/ scheduled Bank

as per MCI's norms. However, medical colleges/ institutions governed by the State Govt. are required to furnish only an undertaking to provide funds in their budget till the facilities are fully provided as per time bound programme indicated by them.

4. The Medical Colleges/ institutions will provide undertaking to implement the decision regarding payment of stipend to the PG students similar to PG students of Govt. Medical Colleges in their State.
5. The Govt. Medical College(s) (except those colleges located in J&K) should give an undertaking authorizing Medical Counselling Committee (MCC), Directorate General of Health Services, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India to include 50% of PG (Medical) seats in All India Quota PG seats for the year 2020-21.
6. The Board of Governors reserve the right to withdraw/cancel/revoke the Letter of Intent/Letter of Permission if it comes to the notice that the permission has been obtained from Board of Governors by misrepresentation of fact or fraud.

It shall be incumbent upon the Medical College that the information relating to admission should be submitted within the time specified in the circular in this regards issued by this office from time to time. Any failure to submit the information within this time limit would be construed that the admission in the College were not in accordance with the statutory requirements, thereby enabling the Council to proceed in accordance with law against the college.

Action to grant formal permission of the Board of Governors for increased intake/starting of the said course at your college will be initiated on receipt of appropriate bank guarantee, if applicable and undertaking/ compliance letter fulfilling the conditions enumerated above. The acceptance letter may be sent within one month from the date of issue of this letter to enable the Board of Governors to issue Letter of Permission for the academic year 2020-21.
